

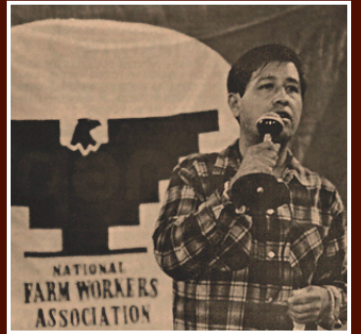

THE 1965 DELANO GRAPE STRIKE: EXPLORING NEW PERSPECTIVES

The Walter Stiern Library and Public History Institute, in partnership with Bakersfield College, will explore the 1965 Delano Grape Strike over three days of events, **September 24-26**, on the 50th anniversary of this milestone in American labor history.

The events at CSUB are intended to coincide with the United Farm Workers' celebration of the strike on Saturday, September 26, in Delano, and a number of events scheduled at Bakersfield College on Thursday, September 24.
